People with Cystic Fibrosis (CF) often look healthy, but it's a life-limiting condition that affects those living with it in many ways. The condition is caused by a genetic mutation that means cells in the human body are unable to move salt and water around effectively. This results in a build-up of thick mucus in the lungs and digestive system, as well as a number of other effects. People with CF are particularly susceptible to lung infections, and as such have to take precautions to avoid exposure to harmful bacteria and other bugs. For example, two people with the condition should never meet in person, as they are each at risk of cross-infection - passing on harmful bugs to each other.
